4.4 Budget Process for Fiscal Year 2020/21

Since both VSD and IWA have new General Managers, Beverli Marshall wanted to open a conversation on the budget process. Trish Rhay inquired how the process worked in the past. Historically IWA has bee the fiscal agent for EVRA. There was agreement that IWA continue to handle the finance aspect of the JPA and VSD take care of the Administration tasks. Ms. Marshall stated that she would bring back a resolution to formalize the duties. Ms. Rhay questioned how the JPA process works. It was explained that decisions made at the EVRA meetings would then be taken back to each agencies board or council to be approved.

4.5 Recycled Water Project Update

Reymundo Trejo, Assistant Manager, IWA, gave a project update. He has reviewed all the studies that have been done so far. The hope is to replenish the water table by way of injection at VSD. President Miller prefers to start putting money into the project and stop pushing it off. The board would like to see the full wish list reflected into the budget. Ms. Marshall and Ms. Rhay stated their goal is for both agencies work as a team. Ms. Marshall thanked IWA for moving forward with this.

5. <u>GENERAL MANAGERS' REPORT</u>

Trish Rhay, General Manager, IWA gave an update Indio Water Authority's upcoming water supply project, finalization of details of long-range plan including rehabilitation and growth needs. She also spoke of a letter sent out by the Regional Water Board not accepting Salt and Nutrient Plans for the Coachella Valley.

1. BUDGET INTRODUCTION

The East Valley Reclamation Authority (EVRA) was formed on December 18, 2013 with joint partnering agencies, the City of Indio-Indio Water Authority (the City of Indio's municipal water supplier), and Valley Sanitary District (wastewater provider for serving Indio).

The purpose of the EVRA is to develop and implement a planning, programming, funding, construction and operation strategy for a joint reclaimed/recycled water facility. This joint project will allow IWA to provide either recycled water for non-potable use or treated water for groundwater replenishment. Both uses will reduce the City of Indio's overall dependence on existing groundwater supply.

2. REVENUE

For fiscal year 2020-21, EVRA will acquire revenue totaling \$63,855 which will be contributed equally from each partnering agency (31,927.50 each). An expected ending fund balance from fiscal year 2019-20 of \$257,145 will bring the total operating fund balance available to \$321,000 for fiscal year 2020-21. EVRA will also continue to seek grant funding as needed for future projects during the upcoming fiscal year

3. EXPENDITURES AND USES

Total expenses are proposed to be \$321,000, which will be allocated towards legal fees, feasibility study, office supplies, professional dues to recycled water association, Board stipends, and meetings and travel for both the Board and Management staff to attend recycled water conferences and meetings.

RESOLUTION OF THE EAST VALLEY RECLAMATION AUTHORITY ADOPTING THE 2020-21 BUDGET AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES AND APPROPRIATIONS RELATED THERETO

WHEREAS, the East Valley Reclamation Authority (the "Authority") is a joint powers authority duly organized and existing under and pursuant to Articles 1 through 4 (commencing with Section 6500), Chapter 5, Division 7, Title 1 of the California Government Code (the "Act") pursuant to that certain Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement, dated as of November 18, 2013, (the "Joint Powers Agreement"), by and between the City of Indio (the "City") and the Valley Sanitary District (the "District");

WHEREAS, the proposed 2020-21 budget provides for service levels necessary to respond to the high standards of the community which are deemed appropriate by the Authority and concurrently provides a work force to accomplish them; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to use the recommended 2020-21 budget as a guide for determining Authority priorities.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE EAST VALLEY RECLAMATION AUTHORITY HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The above recitals, and each of them, are true and correct.

Section 2. The proposed 2020-21 budget, as detailed in the budget document entitled "East Valley Reclamation Authority Fiscal Year 2020-21 Recommended Operating Budget," and filed with the Secretary, and as summarized below is hereby adopted:
